Mother Teresa House Updates

This past month we had our Volunteer Appreciation Event where we got to honor and thank all of our volunteers for their hard work and dedication. We shared a meal together, reflected on the past year at Mother Teresa House, and distributed volunteer awards. Following that, we did a group team building exercise and finished out the evening spending time together.

We are so blessed to be able to serve in this ministry, it would not be possible without our volunteers. Over the past year, because of the commitment our volunteers have shown, we have been able to care for 22 guests: 17 at our Lansing location, and 5 at our new Williamston location, 17 guests were from Ingham County, and 1 each from Clinton, Ionia, and Montcalm County, 10 Catholics, 8 Christians, and 4 with no faith association. Our volunteers helped us impact the lives of 22 lovely people and countless more family members and friends.

Stories of impact: this month's story is about how Mother Teresa House impacted our student volunteer Davis Christy.

I began volunteering at Mother Teresa House (MTH) during my freshman year at MSU after a friend encouraged me to get involved. At first, my motivation was simple—I wanted experience in a healthcare setting as I prepare for medical school. What I didn't expect was how much this place would change me.

Volunteering at MTH quickly became more than "experience." It has given me perspective, community, and gratitude. Caring for guests at the end of life has reminded me never to take my own life for granted. Even in difficult circumstances, our guests show remarkable gratitude for caregivers and volunteers. Their kindness inspires me to seek out gratitude and compassion in my own daily life.

I've also been moved by the trust that fills MTH. Guests know that anyone who walks through the door is there to help, and families place incredible faith in the volunteers and caregivers. That sense of community makes every visit meaningful.

One guest in particular stays with me. Early on, she kept me busy—always standing up and walking away just as I thought she was settled. But over time, we built a connection through countless games of War, coloring books, and watching WWE. As her health declined, she continued to greet me with a smile until her passing. Her smile truly made my day every time I would see her and reminded me of why I was here.

Before MTH, I had little experience with death. The first loss of a guest startled me, but I quickly realized that MTH is not about waiting for death. It's about making each day meaningful, creating memories, and cherishing the time we have.

Serving at MTH has made me more thankful, more compassionate, and more grounded. It is a privilege to be part of this home.
